Acts 6:1 Trouble at the food bank?

In those days when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenistic Jews among them complained against the Hebraic Jews because their widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food.

Acts 6:2-4 Called to wait on tables??

So the Twelve gathered all the disciples together and said, "It would not be right for us to neglect the ministry of the word of God in order to wait on tables. Brothers and sisters, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them and will give our attention to prayer and the ministry of the word."

Acts 6:5-6 Stephen's appointment

This proposal pleased the whole group. They chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit; also Philip, Procorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas from Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

Acts 6:8 Stephen's work at the food bank :-o

Stephen, a man full of God's grace and power, performed great wonders and signs among the people.

Acts 6:9-10 Stephen opposed

Opposition arose, however, from members of the Synagogue of the Freedmen (as it was called)— Jews of Cyrene and Alexandria as well as the provinces of Cilicia and Asia—who began to argue with Stephen. But they could not stand up against the wisdom the Spirit gave him as he spoke.

Acts 6:12-13, 15 Stephen accused

So they stirred up the people and the elders and the teachers of the law. They seized Stephen and brought him before the Sanhedrin. They produced false witnesses, who testified, "This fellow never stops speaking against this holy place and against the law.

All who were sitting in the Sanhedrin looked intently at Stephen, and they saw that his face was like the face of an angel.

Acts 7:1-53 Stephen's challenge / provocation

"Because the patriarchs were jealous of Joseph, they sold him as a slave into Egypt. But God was with him and rescued him from all his troubles.

"This is the same Moses they had rejected with the words, 'Who made you ruler and judge?' He was sent to be their ruler and deliverer by God himself, through the angel who appeared to him in the bush.

Was there ever a prophet your ancestors did not persecute?... And now you have betrayed and murdered [the Righteous One]— you who have received the law that was given through angels but have not obeyed it."

Acts 7:54 The religious court responds

When the members of the Sanhedrin heard this, they were furious and gnashed their teeth at him.

Acts 7:55-56 Stephen's vision

But Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. "Look," he said, "I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God."

Acts 7:59-60 Stephen's final words

While they were stoning him, Stephen prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." Then he fell on his knees and cried out, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he fell asleep.

Acts 8:1 The early church scattered

And Saul approved of their killing him.

On that day a great persecution broke out against the church in Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria.

What was Stephen like? (2)

Hellenistic Jew

Good at food distribution

Full of God's Spirit

=> A bit like Jesus

Full of God's grace

=> Loving, gracious

Full of wisdom

=> Knows scripture

& sees things from God's side

Full of faith

=> Trusts God

& wouldn't keep quiet

Performed great wonders and signs

=> Fed the hungry and healed the sick

Prays the same prayers

=> Copying Jesus

Saw the glory of God...

=> Had a clear vision of Jesus

Why was Stephen like that?

But Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus

standing at the right hand of God.

Stephen had a vision of Jesus
That halped him had like Jesus

That helped him be like Jesus

gentle and humble in heart (Mat.11:29)
